AGO Bookmark File

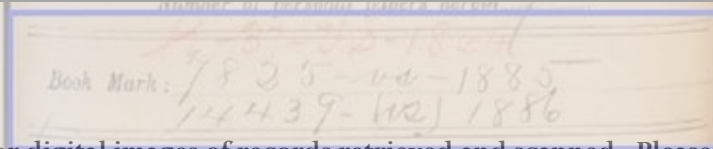
- ❖ A bookmark is a cross-reference to a file located in the Adjutant General's records held at the National Archives.
- ❖ Bookmarks are frequently recorded on the front jacket of a soldier's CMSR, on the inside of the jacket, on an individual card in the CMSR, on a page in a private law, a document from another bookmark file, or a page in the pension.
- ❖ What might I find? A medal of honor awardee, a court-martial, testimony by your soldier at another soldier's court-martial, attempts to correct official military records, disputes over rank, investigation into a desertion or other event during the war, an audit of a pension, etc.
- ❖ There is no way to know, in advance, what a bookmark file will reveal!
